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

The author, Sir Martin Conway, was an expert English mountaineer who had made expeditions in Europe, South America and in the Himalayas; where he broke a world altitude record upon reaching 23,000 feet. His experience in the Alps was extensive. He was president of the Alpine Club from 1902 to 1904 and became the first president of The Alpine Ski Club at its inaugural meeting in 1908. Much of the information provided here was accumulated while traveling the Alps from end to end.

The artist, Arthur David McCormick was also no stranger to mountaineering. From 1892–1893 he was the official artist on Sir Martin Conway's expedition to the Karakoram subrange of the Himalayas and in 1895 served as artist for Clinton T. Dent's expedition to the Caucasus Mountains. For his work on these and other expeditions he was made Fellow of the Royal Geographical Society. Neate 181. DNB. \$255.

Employing the local color palette of grays, browns, and blacks, with notes of red and blue in costumes and skies, Forestier achieves great atmospheric renderings of this historic area. The quality of austerity is highlighted by glimpses of colorful stained glass windows and verdant meadows. Sir Amédée Forestier was an Anglo-French artist and illustrator who specialized in historical scenes, and landscapes. His paintings are notable for their attention to detail. \$125.

Though the colourplates steal most of one's attention it should be noted that Tuker's text is extremely well researched and covers the origins of the university, the colleges, degree-giving, social and collegiate life, university men and more. The author states in his preface that he believes this to the first time that a chapter on the woman's colleges has anywhere appeared and is certain it's the first time such a chapter is part of an account of the University.

She particularly loved the picturesque farmhouses and cottages of Surrey and Sussex for which she became famous. She went on to paint rural scenes in other parts of the country – Middlesex, Kent, the Isle of Wight and the West Country – and abroad in Venice, Italy. It is notable that other then a handful of paintings from Venice she never painted outside of England, never in Scotland, never in Wales. Many years of her paintings were collected into this publication, appropriately named HAPPY ENGLAND.

When a man possessed by the genius of the place quits the city to reside elsewhere, the horizon of his life contracts and dwindles, as when a man descends from the wide views of a mountain peak to the life pent within the walls of a valley. For nowhere else is the mind not only confronted, but, if one may thus express it, assailed by so many varied subjects demanding consideration, or the heart appealed to by so many interests for its sympathy...But the future destiny of a city which has acted so great a part in the past, and which is capable of acting an even greater part in the time to come, is only another reason why life here is so large. What other city presents such a problem? One may as soon dwell by the shore of an ocean, or in view of peaks rising to heaven, and fail to be impressed by the greatness of the world, as live in Constantinople without realizing the vastness of human interest and problems." The text is especially significant given the time period; it was written just a few years before WWI and during the consolidation of the nation-state.

So much so, indeed, that he was buried with full naval honours in 1931. In a moving ceremony, reminiscent of Nelson's state funeral in 1806, his body was rowed up Portsmouth Harbour in a naval cutter past battleships with dipped colours and bugles calling and quaysides lined with dockyard workers. \$425.

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
